

# If Walls Could Worship

## DISCUSSION GUIDE

### OPENING REFLECTION

Read aloud:

If worship was never meant to stay inside church walls, what would it look like in your home this week?

Take one quiet minute.

Then share one honest example from the past few days.

### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

#### Part 1: Holy Spaces (*Worship Reframed*)

- How did you define a “holy space” before reading this section?
- What assumptions about worship were confronted?
- In what ways have you unintentionally limited worship to certain environments?
- What changes when holiness is tied to God’s presence rather than a location?

#### Part 2: Everyday Altars (*Worship Practiced*)

- What does an ‘altar’ look like in your current season?
- Which chapter most challenged how you think about obedience?
- Where do small, repeated acts of faithfulness feel insignificant to you?
- How might steady obedience reshape your understanding of spiritual maturity?

#### Part 3: The Unpolished Corners (*Worship That Surrenders Control*)

- Which ‘unpolished corner’ in the book felt most familiar to you?
- Where do you see control competing with surrender in your life?
- How does surrender differ from giving up?
- What part of obedience feels costly right now?

#### Part 4: The Things We Carry (*Worship That Goes With You*)

- What does it mean to carry worship rather than visit it?
- How does identity ‘in Christ’ sustain worship beyond emotional moments?
- What are you currently carrying that shapes your worship – fear, responsibility, grief, calling?
- How might seeing those burdens through the lens of allegiance change how you carry them?

### PERSONAL APPLICATION:

Where have you been treating worship as a location instead of allegiance?

Where is God inviting you to build an everyday altar?

What are you holding that needs to be let go?

What are you carrying right now? How might remembering your identity ‘in Christ’ change how you carry it?
